INTRODUCTION

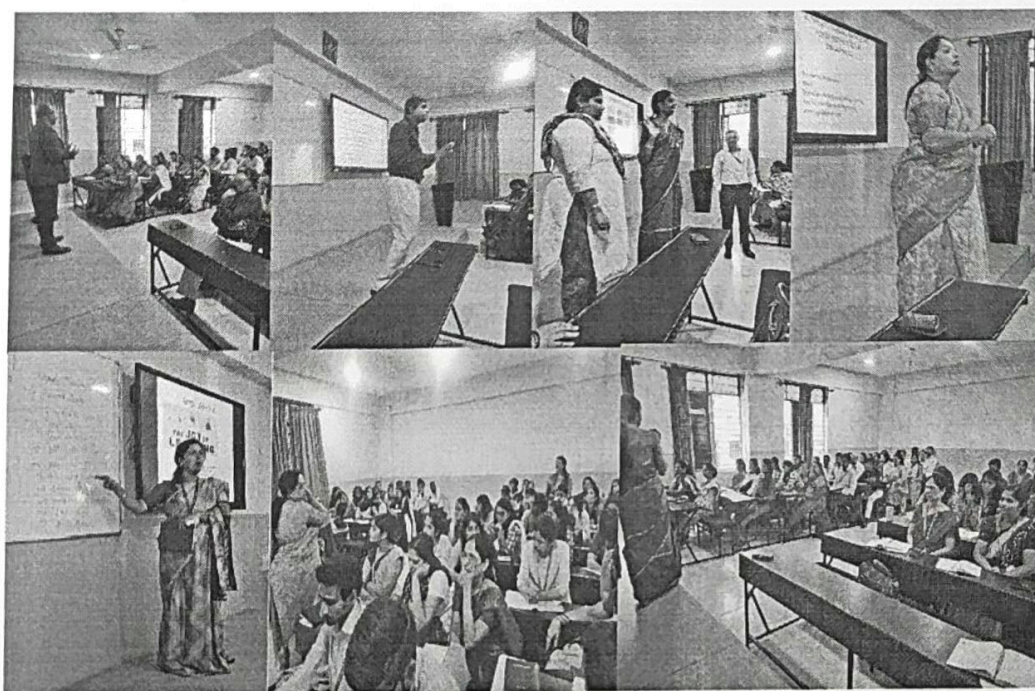

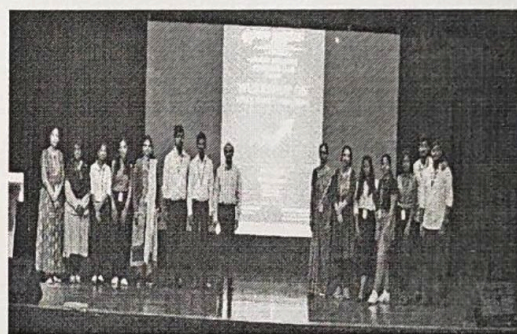
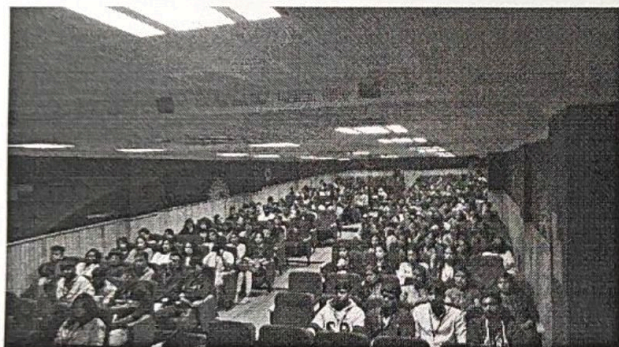

7. Role of IQAC towards Contributing/Monitoring/Evaluating the Teaching & Learning processes for year 2021-22

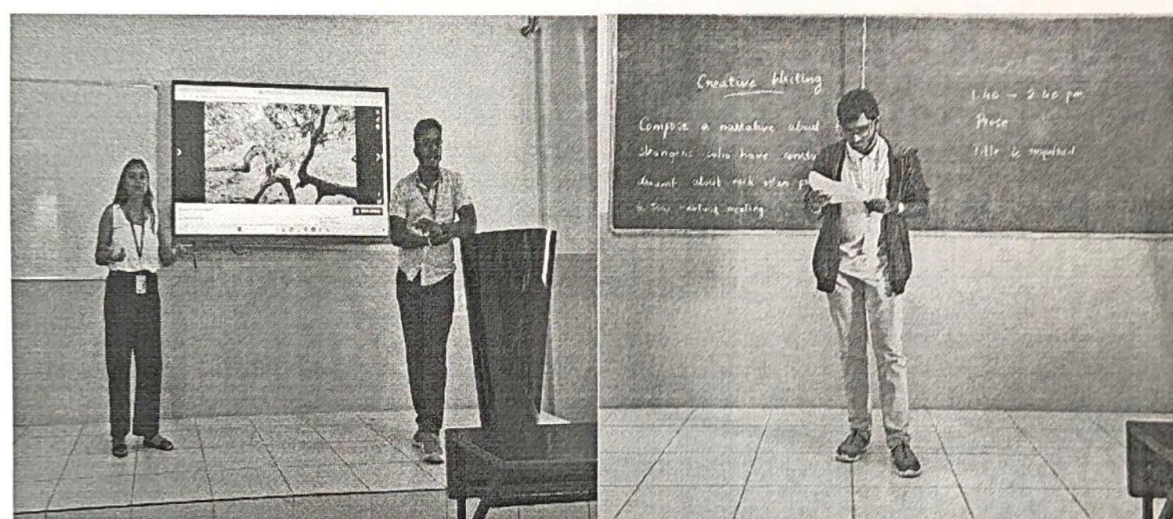
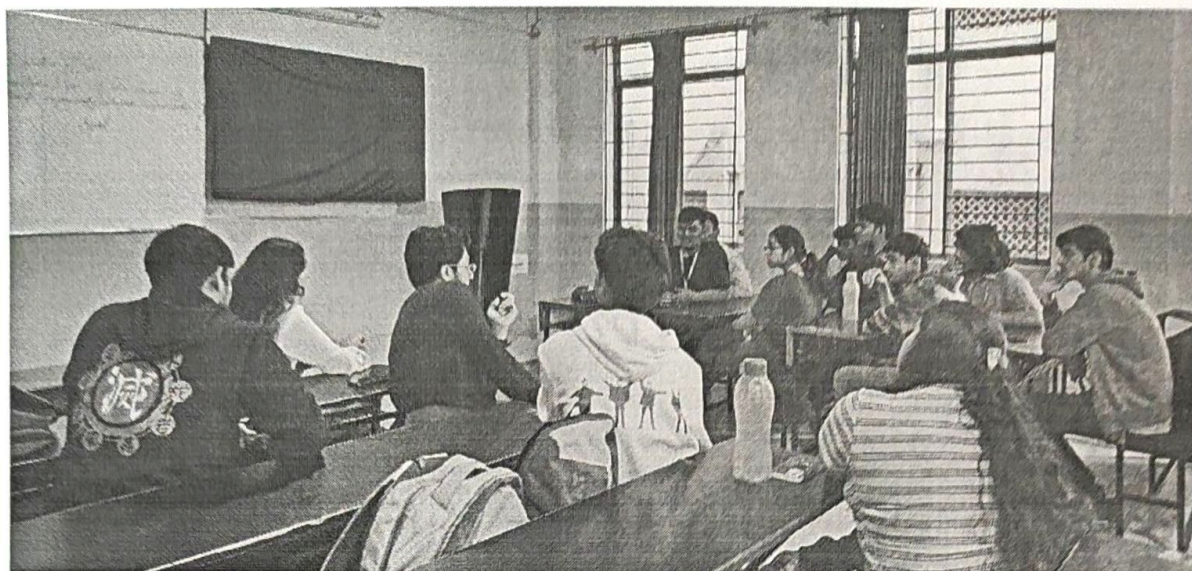
The Institutional IQAC members monitor the following activities of Teaching-Learning processes:

- Students Feedback once a semester and ensure that the reports are being discussed with the respective faculty members.

Curriculum Delivery:

A well-defined approach addressing the finer aspects of teaching-learning practice is regularly developed through continuous learning and training by all the faculty members. This takes the form of strictly following time schedules, reports and records, assessments and evaluation, and parallelly giving importance to ICT teaching-learning through online/offline mode using various platforms.

At NHC, learner-centric integrated learning methods are employed that enable the students to come forward and lead the classes. Images show students actively leading the learning process through discussions, presentations, and collaborative learning.



Student Competency Enrichment:

Competency enrichment of students is one of the essential focus areas in which constant need-based skillsets through training are offered to the students. This is done through the various Value-Added Programs and other hands-on learning programs. This has shown tremendous improvement in the students' competency levels related to progression and placement.

Faculty Development:

The best outcome of teaching-learning is the reflection of faculty development and enrichment. This is done by encouraging teachers to present and publish research papers, empowering faculty on emerging trends in teaching, to take up online certification programs such as MOOC, NPTEL, SWAYAM, INTERNSHALA, COURSERA, and higher qualifications such as MPhil/Ph.D., NET/SLET, etc.

Research Areas:

Teachers are encouraged to undertake minor and major projects, and in-turn, facilitate and guide students by encouraging them to take up research-oriented studies. Such involvement in research has shown improvement in academics.

Collaborative Agreements:

The institution has established collaborative agreements with corporates and has signed MoUs for offering professional training in soft skills, technological and managerial. This is offered to increase their practical knowledge and skills to keep in tune with the market requirements. These programs are made to offer by Authorized Training Partners (ATPs) of major companies and professionals.

Extension and Outreach Services:

The extension programs are those executed by the staff and students independently and jointly. A series of such programs have been conducted wherein students and faculty can apply the theoretical knowledge into practice that promotes quality among them. Similarly, outreach programs are made to be conducted majorly by the students to create a sense of

social responsibility and consciousness: such as Operation Smile conducted at Yashomathi Hospital, Marathahalli, Bangalore where 35 students of NHC volunteered, and Clean Village program at Bovipalya, Bangalore rural where NSS, Eco Club and Outreach Club students volunteered to clean the village.



Optimal Utilization of Human and Financial Resources:

The institution has always ensured the optimal use of Human and Financial resources with the help of the Human Resource Department and Finance Department.
