#### INTRODUCTION

The Principal of the New Horizon College, Marathahalli, has constituted an Internal Academic and Administrative Audit Committee for 2022-23. The terms of reference are:

- To carry out a comprehensive review of the facilities and workings with particular reference to holistic quality improvement that has been implemented in academic and administrative mechanisms
- 2. To carry out a total academic and administrative audit of the institution.
- 3. The audit process will involve escorted tours to the physical facilities, interaction with heads of departments, faculty, students, their parents, alumni, employees, and other stakeholders, and review of documents. The members may request any additional documents/clarification required for successfully completing the audit process. The audit process will also include the assessment of the action taken report provided by the college on the recommendations made by the Peer Team.

#### Constitution of the AAA Committee:

As per the UGC directive of 2004, all the higher education institutions in the country have to go for yearly compulsory Academic and Administrative Audit. The management of the college is committed to bringing necessary reforms for achieving quality and excellence in academic and administrative matters, in tune with the vision and mission of the institution, which is imperative by appointment of the committee of renowned academicians. Realizing the significance of the task, administrative discipline, and accountability, the AAA committee is constituted for the academic year 2022-23.

### 1.0 Executive Summary

In accordance with the Audit and Evaluation Plan of New Horizon College, Marathahalli, for 2022-23, the Academic and Administrative Audit Committee team conducted an audit of the college in September 2022.

The purpose of the audit was to ensure that the practices followed on the campus were in accordance with the Teaching and Administrative Policy adopted by the institution. With this in mind, the specific objectives of the audit were to evaluate the adequacy of the management control framework and the degree to which the Departments comply with the applicable regulations, policies, and standards.

The analysis was based onexamining the policies, manuals, and standards and on the results of preliminary interviews with personnel considered key in the teaching and administrative management in the campus. The criteria and methods used in the audit were based on predetermined standards. The methodology used included a physical inspection of the campus, a review of the relevant documentation, and interviews.

#### 2.0 Statement of Assurance

This audit has been conducted in accordance with the Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing as prescribed by NAAC and other bodies. In our professional judgment, sufficient and appropriate audit procedures were completed, and evidence was gathered to support the accuracy of the conclusions reached and contained in this report. The conclusions are based on comparing the situations during the audit with the established criteria.

### 3.0 Objectives and Scope

### Objectives:

- To understand the existing system, assess the Departments and Administrative Units' strengths and weaknesses and suggest methods for improvement and overcoming the weaknesses.
- To identify the bottlenecks in the existing administrative mechanisms and the opportunities for academic and administrative reforms.
- 3. To evaluate the optimum utilization of financial and other resources.
- To suggest methods for continuous quality improvement, keeping in mind the criteria and reports by NAAC and other bodies.

#### Scope:-

This audit was conducted for New Horizon College, Marathahalli campus, Bangalore, and all departments of the institution operating from the Marathahalli campus.

### 4.0 Methodology

This audit combined physical inspection with a review of relevant documentation and interviews with various stakeholders to meet its objectives. AAA Committee visited the college's various departments, computer labs, sports section, NSS office, and other offices. AAA committee assessed the performance of the teaching faculties through the presentations made by them in respect of their academic performance. AAA committee had an interaction with various stakeholders of the college, like, students and management, to assess academic and administrative performance. AAA committee also monitored the other infrastructure facilities provided in the college, like classrooms, library, washroom, ventilation, and lighting. AAA committee also looked into various facilities and welfare schemes provided to SC, ST, OBC, Minorities and Female students.

#### · Review of the Documentation

For the purpose of this audit, the Academic Policy of the institute was reviewed.

#### Interviews

Interviews were conducted with the Principal, and also faculties and students.

### · Physical Inspection

The audit team was in college to inspect the campus.
